CONSENT AGENDA

A motion to approve the consent agenda from the April 26, 2023 and May 10, 2023 Board of Directors meeting was made by Vice President Steve Thoroughman. The motion was seconded by Secretary / Treasurer Buner Ellis III and unanimously approved.

FINANCIAL REPORT (CFO Fawcett)

CORRESPONDENCE (FC Davis)

CITY COUNCIL (Councilor Davis)

Scott Archer is now employed in Salem and Eileen Stein is now interim City Administrator, whom Chief Davis met with this week. Numerous resolutions and ordinances have been passed by the Council lately. The Maple Street Park fields will be re-turfed, and lights are to be installed as well as the community park along the Molalla River will be redone around June / July in order to increase parking and put in new restrooms. The budget process has begun for the City.

CHIEF'S REPORT

Levy Results (FC Davis)

As of the last update, the levy has passed with a 60.54% yes vote. Thank you to the Board and Union for the support in moving forward with the levy. This passage speaks very highly of our community and their support.

Company Officer Promotional Testing (FC Davis)

This promotional testing occurred last week at Canby Foursquare Church and went very well as a joint test between Canby, Molalla, and Woodburn Fire.

Tabletop Exercise (FC Davis)

A disaster exercise covering a train derailment was performed at the EOC at the Police Station with representatives from the Canby Police Department, Canby School District, Canby Utility, Canby Public Works, Canby Fire, City of Canby, and Union Pacific Railroad. The main goal was to get each group in discussion then leave with takeaways to improve their procedures for incidents such as this one. After the exercise and discussions, AT&T FirstNet did a demonstration of their mobile unit. The Emergency Communications trailer and the Rotary Ready trailer were also present to share information.

Open Burning Status (FC Davis)

The communication strategy in place between all departments in Clackamas County has been working very well. Shawn Olson of Clackamas Fire is the lead on this and sends the notifications out to everyone, including on the GroupMe text app. Other counties are also notified of any changes to our status so they can align with us if they feel necessary and stay in the loop.

Administrative Report (CFO Fawcett)

CFO Fawcett reported on her work on the budget, audit, archiving files, the apparatus replacement schedule update, strategic plan matrix update, and submitting the LB1 and LB50 forms after tonight, to be posted in early June.

AAIII Shaw reported assisting with the Captain / Lieutenant promotional assessment center, working on ambulance reconciliations, stated payroll is going well with continuous updates / bettering of processes, and working on an updated Canby Fire website to match more of how the City's website is laid out for ease of finding information.

EMS Report (DC Dale)

Response Times Compliance Standards and Key Performance Indicators worksheets were provided to the Board for review. Chief Davis and Chief Dale had a great meeting today with Monitor, Mt. Angel, and Molalla Fire to discuss boundaries and the two different dispatch centers. Chief Dale continues to meet with the Canby Prevention Coalition on Opioid prevention and met with a Stryker representative regarding uploading data for QI. A Buprenorphine trial is set to begin July 1. Chief Dale is working with DHS and Molalla Fire on the assisted living facility in regard to the number of calls / transports stemming from the facility. One of our probationary members was signed off as a standalone Paramedic.

Training / Operations Report (DC English)

Multiple Interns / Volunteers have been working on and completing tasks and certifications. Imes and Rotter have been cleared to work on the medic as a Paramedic. Dan Drazan, our newest volunteer, is doing an amazing job on his curriculum. Dan will be going through our internal academy. Wildland RT130 has been completed by the majority of personnel. Metro Area

Wildland school will be June 10th, with a Canby Fire engine and staff vehicle to attend with personnel. On June 6, 8 & 23 crews will attend DPSST training. Chief Walker and English attended the Taskforce Leader Symposium at Sunriver. Canby's CERT group will be involved with the Rotary Ready trailer. The new engine is in service at ST363. Wildland apparatus are getting their services up to date in preparation for fire season. On July 7, 8, 9 & 10 we will upstaff due to train track work being done. We have been adjusting the 900mgh pagers to hit all stations for all large events, which Lieutenant Anstine continues to work on as one of his light duty assignments.

Community Risk Reduction Report (DC Walker)

The Board-supported capacity grant with OSFM was not received by Canby Fire, but instead it was awarded to smaller volunteer departments. The summer capacity wildland grant has not been announced, so we are still in the running. Chief Walker is working with the state to make sure we are up to date on our OHA / DHS Care facility certifications. Occupancy at the old police station discussions have been had for the building. The FOB outdoor space project is moving forward. Chief Walker and the Wildfire Community Risk Plan group are talking about the plan to try and get it done in time for fire season. Okada by Dragonberry received their temporary C of O. The cardlock facility at public works was discussed.

Volunteer Report (DC Austen)

Chief English and Austen have been working very hard to get volunteers certified on taskbooks / apparatus and wildland training. Fourth of July is coming up fast, which this year is paid for, but we still need \$10k for next year's down payment. The Antique Fire Apparatus group had their very first get together, which Chief Austen attended. The Volunteer Picnic details will be released next month.

OLD BUSINESS

District Map Review (Vice President Thoroughman)

Vice President Thoroughman and Chief Davis have not met on this yet. Report next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Fire Chief Position (President Carroll)

The Fire Board has a big decision to make. Thank you to both applicants for your professionalism during this process. The Board wants to make sure they are doing the right thing for the community and also for the fire department. The Board has decided to delay the decision so that two Board representatives may meet with two Union representatives regarding any concerns or issues that the group has, prior to the Board making a decision. There will be no decision tonight. President Carroll appreciates everyone being here to support the candidates. Secretary / Treasurer Buner Ellis III and Director Ron Swor will be the representatives from the Board. Union representatives will coordinate with Chief Davis. This meeting will take place as soon as possible in order to compile information for the Board.

Supplemental Budget Resolution #2023-02 (CFO Fawcett)

The Supplemental Budget Resolution #2023-02 packet was presented to the Board, which highlighted budget details regarding the areas of change.

A motion to approve Resolution #2023-02, a Resolution approving and adopting the FY 2022/2023 Supplemental Budget, and to make appropriations, was made by Vice President Steve Thoroughman. The motion was seconded by Director Connie Austen and unanimously approved.

Fire Chief Contract (FC Davis)

This item is being tabled until next month.

Apparatus IGA (FC Davis)

This is the normal IGA with Clackamas Fire District to update the agreement dates and increased amount, which has been put in the budget. Clackamas Fire does an outstanding job for us.

A motion to approve the intergovernmental agreement for fleet maintenance service between Clackamas Fire District and Canby Fire District was made by Secretary / Treasurer Buner Ellis III. The motion was seconded by President Shawn Carroll and unanimously approved.

As a citizen of this community and officer of this Fire District, I would like tot hank you for your service and dedication. I know that you take the responsibility of choosing our next Fire Chief very seriously. I love this organization and I love this city and, like you, I sincerely desire to see both thrive. We are united in purpose – to selflessly serve this community while carefully stewarding the resources and trust which the public has given us. While we are united in purpose, we differ in perspective. I would like to offer you some of my perspective in the hope that it will aid you in your decision making.

I have had the opportunity to work closely with both candidates as their subordinate. Furthermore, I am a long-time student of leadership and always take a keen interest in the leadership styles, abilities, and effectiveness of those leaders around me. My name's Roger McKinnon, I live here in District at 24562 S Molalla Forest Road, I've been a resident of Canby for about thirty years. I'm a former volunteer here, retired professional firefighter, father of a volunteer here at one point. I also would like to endorse Jim Walker. What is the budget here, 6-7 million dollars? I think you've got to have some kind of degree. There's not a company in this country that has someone running that big of a business without having some kind of advanced degree. My personal experience that I'd really like to speak about is with my son, who was here at Canby Fire and was not very well treated by one of your candidates, so much so that he couldn't wait to get out of here. It was a time in his life when he should have been super, super excited about being a firefighter. He has now become a professional firefighter elsewhere, but was very unhappy with the way he was treated here at Canby Fire. Having been a firefighter, being a Chief is a customer service business for our clients out there and also internal customer service. I've had one dealing with Jim Walker, he came to my house, I was burning illegally. He came and was very, very professional and handled it very professionally and solved the problem without any complication at all. I have also had some dealings, slight, with one of your other candidates and walked away with a very sour taste in my mouth. I also fish a lot with a lot of Canby Firefighters and there is very, very high praise within this organization for Jim Walker and very low praise for the other candidate. That's it, thank you.
